

Year 4 Remote Learning Daily Plan - Day 15 - Thursday 28th January

<p>Maths</p>	<p>Main Lesson -Correspondence problems. There is no Seesaw video today. Start by watching today's Maths video called 'Counting squares' https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-4/spring-week-4-measurement-area/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pause the video after 15 seconds - have a go at the 'Get Ready' questions on a piece of paper. The answers will follow so you can mark your own work. • Watch the next section of the video -pause the video at 1 minutes and 32 seconds. Which shape would be best to fill the rectangle and why? • Watch the next section of the video -pause the video at 2 minutes and 46 seconds. Can you calculate the area of the shapes? • Watch the next section of the video -pause the video at 3 minutes and 29 seconds. Can you calculate the amount of green, orange, purple and white squares then find the total area? • Now have a go at question 1-4 on your worksheet. • Watch the next section of the video -pause the video at 6 minutes and 05 seconds. Can you find the total area using Amir's method? • Watch the next section of the video -pause the video at 7 minutes and 22 seconds. Have a go at calculating the area of the shapes. Remember that two half squares will make 1 whole square. • Now complete the rest of your worksheet. • There is an extension on the school website under the home learning tab. This does NOT need to be completed but is there if you want to extend your learning.
<p>English/ Guided Reading</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look at the picture on the resource page. This is our new guided reading book that we are going to be using for the next 6 weeks. From the front cover, do you think this text is going to be fiction or non-fiction? Remember, fiction is a made-up story and non-fiction is a text that is based on facts and information. What on the front cover tells you it is this type of text? • What do you think this book is called? Why do you think this? Can you make a link to something else we are learning about? • Using the images on the resource page, match up the words at the top of the page to the correct image. • Now look at the contents page. Have a go at completing the questions at the bottom of the resource page.
<p>Computing</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This activity can be completed on a laptop or iPad/tablet, which ever you have access to. • Today, I would like you to use the Hour of Code website again and complete the 'Coding Adventure' https://studio.code.org/s/aquatic/stage/1/puzzle/1 • There are tips at the beginning of each level to help you so please make sure you read through the instructions before attempting the level as new commands are introduced. When you have completed a level, take a screenshot as you progress through the activities. • If you are working on a laptop, you can use a word document to save your screen shots at the end of each level. Remember- you need to use the CTRL button and the PrtSc button to take a screenshot of your screen and then paste your image into your word document. Make sure your work is then uploaded to Seesaw. • If you are working on an iPad or tablet, you can screenshot each level and then add them to Seesaw as a series of images.
<p>Sumdog</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I have set you a Sumdog challenge based on area and perimeter. We have looked at perimeter this year so I hope this is going to be some revision for you. • Remember that area is the space inside the shape and perimeter is the distance around the outside of the shape. <div data-bbox="1257 1688 1469 1973" style="text-align: right;"> </div>

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
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
